Franklin Templeton Investments Memorial 5K Run/Walk Participant Release, Waiver and Indemnity Agreement ("Agreement") I acknowledge that to participate in any way in the Franklin Templeton Investments Memorial 5K Run/Walk (including time before and after the competition, the "race") by running, walking, observing, officiating, or volunteering ("participate") is potentially hazardous and involves risks of serious injury, permanent disability, death and property damage ("risks"). I agree that I will not participate unless I am prepared to do so without harm to myself and I have properly trained in preparation for the race and am physically fit. I agree and consent to being medically treated by race or medical personnel if medical problems of any kind arise or appear to have arisen, but I understand that there is no obligation to medically treat me and that race or medical personnel may not be available. I agree that race personnel have the right to remove me from the race if, in their opinion, it could be safer for me or for other participants.

I **know and voluntarily assume all risks** associated with participating including, but not limited to, risks resulting from accidents; falls; contact with other participants, spectators, race or medical personnel; animals; the effects of the weather including temperature, humidity, sunlight, storms and lightning; the conditions of the course and traffic on or near it; and medical treatment or lack of it.

Having read this Agreement and knowing these facts, and in consideration of your acceptance of my application to participate in the race, I, for myself and anyone entitled to act on my behalf including, among others, personal representatives, beneficiaries, heirs, next of kin or assigns, **forever waive, release and will fully indemnify, save and hold harmless** Franklin Resources, Inc. and its subsidiaries, partnerships, joint ventures, and related or affiliated business entities and investment companies, and their directors, trustees, officers, agents, employees, and independent contractors, and their representatives and successors (the "Released Parties"), from all claims or liabilities of any kind arising out of my participation in the race, even though they may arise out of inaction, negligence or carelessness on the part of Released Parties or their agents.

I grant full permission to the Released Parties and their agents, to use any photographs, motion pictures, sound recordings, or any other record of any type of the race, for any purpose, be it promotional for remuneration, without financial or other compensation or royalties to me. I expressly agree that the releases, waivers and indemnities provided in this Agreement are intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by applicable law and that if any portion of this Agreement is held to be invalid, the rest of this Agreement shall, notwithstanding, survive and continue in full force and effect.
